If we can't help, we know who can. **Pass it on.**

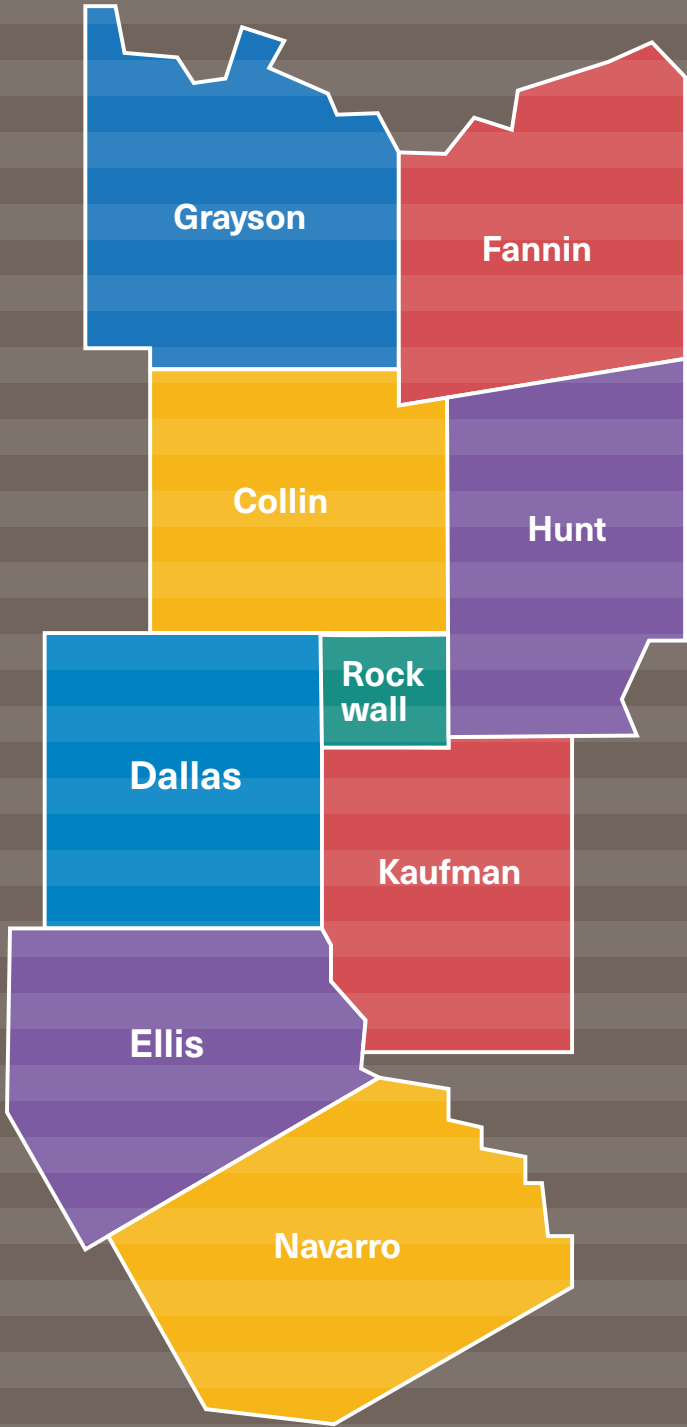
You may have heard us say, "If we can't help, we know who can."

Dear Friends,

“Our work at Catholic Charities Dallas to help those in need is truly a “Holy Work in Progress” and thus our theme for this year’s efforts and this annual report. We are so proud to be CCD: a team of incredible professionals working tirelessly to help lift up real lives. As you will read within this report, this past year is another testament to that work and impact, and we are thrilled to have your interest and support.

Some of our highlights from this past year include:

- **Hunger** services grew to 128 drops at 93 unique locations to provide nearly 7,500,000 meals
- Helped 250+ **homeless** in our community to find housing and access case management
- Fully renovated the Marillac Center to ensure a safe, up-to-date home for our Brady **Senior** program
- Served a record-high 22,000+ clients seeking **immigration** assistance
- Initiated a holistic software platform to enhance case management, tracking, referrals, impact, outcome and trends
- Cared for, then reunited over 250 **children** with their families
- Expanded our Together We’re Better program and widened our **education** impact via three new outreach teams
- Managed \$35 million in relief / **disaster** monies for 11 communities and 43 zip codes to help families pay for home, rent, and utilities
- Answered the call to serve hundreds of Afghan **refugees** while assisting well over 1,000 others from all parts of the world, helping each start a successful new life in America
- Restarted **adoption** post-pandemic, placing infants and "Finally Home" children in permanent homes
- Advanced study and participation with the Lab for Economic Opportunities at Notre Dame to better serve, enhancing our work in preventing and **alleviating poverty**—with over 1,000 enrolled

The above is just a sampling of the countless ways that Catholic Charities Dallas is making a difference throughout nine counties. As you read more and learn more, I am sure it will seem like so much. Still, there is so much more to do. We’re ready for the challenges that lie ahead.

We have grown exponentially, yet we have also taken the time to refresh, expanding our platforms so future needs can be addressed with urgency and efficiency. Speaking of efficiency, CCD was able to limit our administrative expenses to less than 7% of our total revenues, a significant milestone of improvement over previous years of high performance.

We hope that you, too, will take great pride in all that we accomplished this past year. It is the effort of an entire community that collectively makes a difference in the lives of so many in need. Yes, CCD’s efforts are truly a “Holy Work in Progress.” We look gratefully on the past and hopefully toward the future.

**Our goal is simple: to make a profound difference in the lives of those facing housing insecurity. For homeless seniors, our St. Jude Center-Forest Lane provides permanent supportive housing while St. Jude Center-Park Central answers temporary needs of adults. Our Rapid Rehousing program works throughout the area to assist families in crisis. For all, our team responds with full-spectrum solutions designed to restore hope and independence. Case manager Ja'Kel Lloyd shares the story of Charles.**

When Charles was released from prison, he had nowhere to go. He was determined to work hard - and had a job - but his nighttime shift prevented him from finding housing at shelters. A tent in a homeless community seemed to be the only answer. When Dallas City Homeless Outreach staff approached and referred him to Catholic Charities Dallas, Charles felt like he had nothing to lose. He enrolled in our Emergency Housing Voucher program and within 21 days, Charles was settled into an apartment home. He also received our move-in kit of linens, cookware, a mattress, and groceries. Now permanently housed, he says, "My job saved my life and housing is the icing on the cake!"

**C**itizenship workshops, visa assistance, renewals connected with Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals - we advocate for all immigrants in a variety of situations. We support adults and unaccompanied minors alike, reviewing and preparing legal documents, providing pro bono representation when necessary, housing, education, and other services. We’re also exploring new programs such as video consulting pods in order to reach beyond Dallas and help immigrants throughout our nine-county area. Staff Attorney, Laura Shellum shares the story of new arrival, Daniel.

Daniel came to the United States from Honduras with hopes of escaping violence and discrimination. When he ended up in Immigration & Customs Enforcement detention, with no funds for an attorney, he turned to Catholic Charities Dallas. Once there, he was assigned an attorney to represent him in his immigration court asylum case. Detained asylum seekers in Dallas have only a 15% chance of winning their case, but Daniel and his attorney prevailed. The judge ultimately granted him asylum. Instead of being deported, Daniel is now a legal permanent resident with an opportunity to become a citizen in five years.

**The Brady Senior Center is at the heart of our service to seniors. A vibrant, worry-free place to gather, the center welcomes visitors with a range of activities, from dancing to horseshoes, crafts, and computer classes. The DART-accessible location makes for a convenient commute. A home-cooked lunch is free every weekday to those sixty and over. With knowledge gained from the pandemic, our team has become even more responsive, augmenting safety guidelines and adapting services to keep seniors strong, independent, and involved. Grace Mendez tells the story of Ada, who overcame initial hesitation and now thrives at our center.**

Ada loved to socialize, but when severe arthritis set in, her limited mobility led to isolation and, eventually, depression. One day, a friend invited her to the Brady Senior Center. Ada seemed apprehensive at first, saying, “I came with stress. I mingled with everyone, but I was not happy.” In a short time, though, Ada made new friends - connections she now says gave her the strength to cope with adversity. She’s even taken advantage of the center’s fitness courses to ease her arthritis. Today, Ada dances during Zumba sessions, enjoys weekly crocheting classes, and calls our center her second home.

Every child is a gift. Guided by that belief, our team supports families so children can grow up surrounded by love and hope. Our Infant Adoption Program connects birth mothers and babies to nurturing parents who’ve undergone rigorous background screenings. Our Finally Home Program works with the Department of Family and Protective Services to find permanent homes for children. In our Parenting In Action Program, we serve new parents with classes, training and material assistance through a partnership with Hope Supply Company. Case manager Carolina Salazar tells of a special story involving the Taylor family.

Having already adopted a three-year-old boy, the Taylors came to Catholic Charities Dallas with the dream of adding to their family. They hoped to adopt a child to whom their young African American son could relate. They knew it would take time. After a year, our team received word of a woman in labor who hoped to place her child in our adoption program. We quickly responded, and when she reviewed our family profile books, the birth mother knew instantly that the Taylors would be the right choice. They were overjoyed to adopt a baby girl and their son was happy to finally get the little sister he had been asking for.

We’re committed to building a stronger future for families through literacy. With programs like Together We Learn, we boost reading skills for both children and parents. Together We’re Better, a mobile program, expands our reach into high-need communities. To foster a love of learning outside of school hours, we maintain an After School Program, Summer Camp, and Together We Read, a service that fosters literacy for entire families. Our Educational Services locations include the Cardinal Farrell Community Center, a certified Texas School Ready early learning center and our Bachman Lake facility. Case manager Mary Gullo explains how our work brings change even for the very young.

Eddie’s mother brought him to Catholic Charities Dallas to prepare him for success in school. His brothers had thrived in our education programs but for Eddie, reading was an uphill battle. When he started in our After School Program, he guessed at new words or skipped them altogether. He struggled to comprehend what was on the page. After only five months of reading intervention from our program, Eddie improved from 21% to 78% reading accuracy. He now reads with confidence and precision - the beginning of a lifetime activity.

Children’s Services advocates for the safety of minors arriving alone to the United States. Our top priority is family reunification. In the interim, we provide nurturing care for eligible immigrant and refugee youth. That includes St. Mary’s Shelter and extends to the International Foster Care program. Because we serve the truly vulnerable, we have sought and received accreditation by Praesidium, a highly regarded organization dedicated to abuse prevention. Case Manager Mary Rani shares the happy story of Nina.

Not yet 10 years old, Nina was found alone in a dangerous and volatile part of the world. She was first placed in a shelter, then in the Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program - a first step toward resettlement in the United States. At the same time, the Lee family had completed training here to become foster parents. Our team welcomed Nina to the area. We paired her with the Lees, and a bond was formed. Children’s Services has supported the new family since then, providing wraparound case management services that include medical care, skills training, and more. As Nina has grown and flourished, her foster family has now become her forever family, legally adopting Nina after six years.

Every week, throughout nine counties and at over 70 locations, we fight food insecurity and feed those in need. Four food pantries provide nutritious groceries to individuals and families, offering pickup in a clean, safe, friendly location. Our four mobile food pantries take that assistance further afield. These refrigerated box trucks travel throughout our entire area, bringing fresh groceries to underserved communities. The goal? No more food deserts.

When Cara was diagnosed with a serious illness, it changed her diet forever. Major surgery put her on the road to recovery but left her unable to eat the same foods. Grocery shopping became a challenge. After a friend told her about the Jan Pruitt Community Pantry, Cara decided to visit. Would she qualify? Would she find the fresh produce she needed? Nervous at first, Cara was moved by the warm, welcoming staff and was surprised to be served that same day. Cara now visits the pantry regularly and says her favorite part is seeing friendly faces and finding new foods each week. She is especially grateful that she can take as much fresh produce as she needs since she eats fruits and vegetables almost exclusively.

**Real change is lasting change. Our financial counseling and one-on-one coaching can help change lives by navigating debt, credit, and budget issues. For the unemployed and underemployed, we offer placement services, resumé assistance and skills training via our partnership with Dallas County Community Colleges. Through Housing and Urban Development counseling, we can aid renters and new homebuyers as well as at-risk homeowners. It’s how we help break patterns of debt and poverty, and empower people to chart a course for long-term stability. Case manager Carmen Juarez fills in the details of a recent success.**

Cathy had lived in her house for over 15 years. When the pandemic hit, her world started to fall apart. Her partner lost his job and could no longer help with bills. She fell behind on mortgage payments, and by the time she came to Catholic Charities Dallas, she owed more than \$21,000. On her very first visit with us, Cathy found real help. Our counselor reviewed her budget and negotiated with her financial services to secure a loan modification with a lower interest rate and lower monthly payments. With our team's continuing counseling, Cathy has been able regain stability and stay in her longtime home.

In dire times, our team responds with both immediate aid and long-term case management. We're one of the few area programs offering such a far-sighted approach. Individuals and families are supported at every stage of rebuilding, whether from tornadoes, fires, floods, or the pandemic. With an established presence in communities throughout nine counties, we can provide housing vouchers, emergency financial assistance, access to our food pantries, and employment services that ensure success. Case manager Tina Ballard-Carr explains how that approach made the difference for Demetrice.

Evicted from their Garland apartment, Demetrice and his son moved out of town to live with relatives. When he was exposed to COVID-19 shortly afterward, Demetrice faced two dilemmas: loss of income while taking leave from his job, and no room to quarantine in a small house. Options were few. Demetrice moved back to Garland for a temporary stay at a motel. It was then that he turned to Catholic Charities Dallas. His case manager worked with a program manager and area hotels to find Demetrice a home near employment opportunities. Now Demetrice is housed, working, and in the process of signing up for our Financial Stability Program.

**Rebuilding lives in the aftermath of war, persecution, and catastrophe - that’s the mission of Refugee Resettlement Services. We assist families as they enter the United States and place them in homes and in jobs. To support refugees in this new journey toward self-sufficiency and assimilation, we connect them to language and civics classes, provide material help, and assist with legal documents including work permits and Social Security.**

Imagine making a new start as refugees in a new country and having a baby during a pandemic. It presented a unique challenge for one young family. A busy hospital recorded their baby’s name incorrectly. What started as a small mistake became a big burden, blocking the family’s access benefits and medical support. After multiple trips to the hospital and to the City of Dallas Vital Statistics Office, the family turned to our Intensive Case Management team. Communication with the hospital’s records department was established. Soon after, staff there began the process of issuing a corrected certificate, allowing this refugee family to participate in official programs again. Now, they can focus on what really matters - welcoming their new addition.

She is an irreplaceable part of our family at Catholic Charities Dallas. In 13 years of service, Mel has devoted time and effort to nearly all missions, inspired by the immediate and lasting impact of her work. “When I box and deliver food for the pantries, I know that families will eat that night. When I helped with disaster relief, we secured rental assistance for a family and I knew that they could sleep safely for at least a few months. 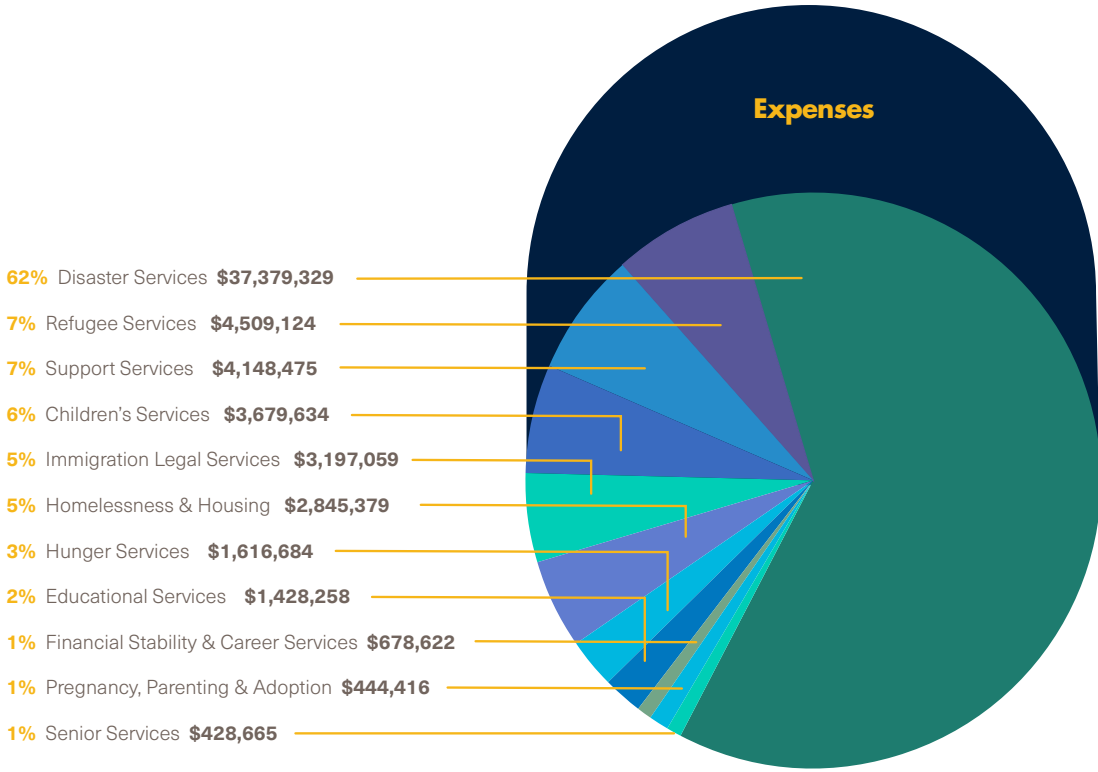
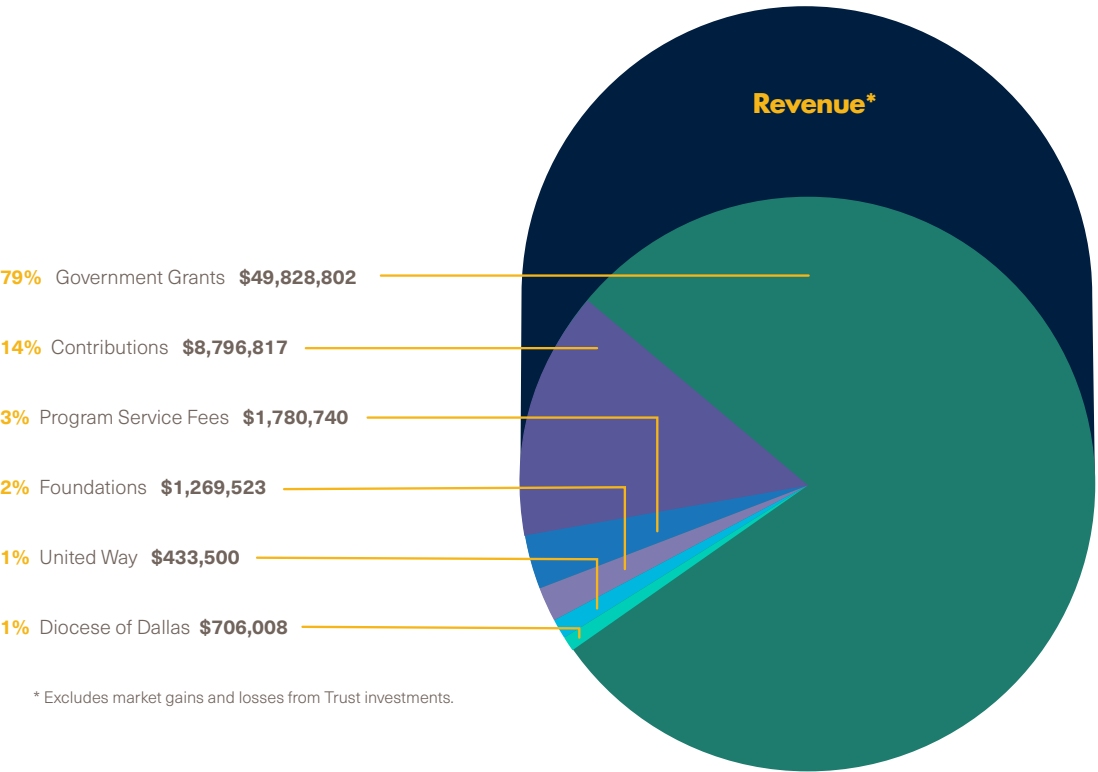
