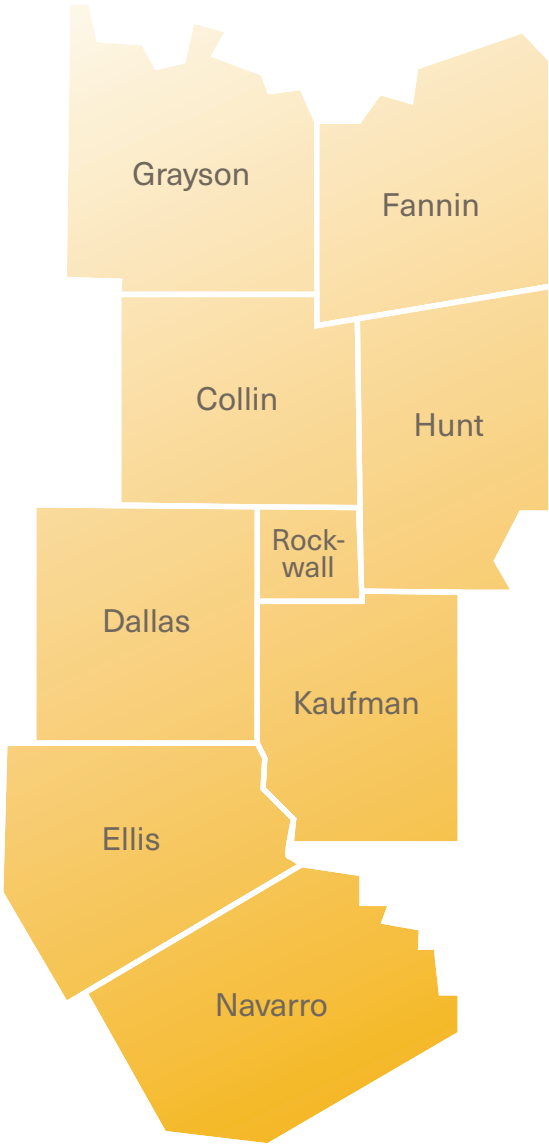

## “ON PAPER IT SAYS FOSTER CARE, BUT THEY ACCEPT US AS THEIR FOREVER CHILDREN.”

As a child, Suzana spent six years of her life in a Malaysian shelter. She dreamed of receiving an education and being part of a loving family. However, it was difficult to imagine this dream becoming a reality due to the religious persecution she faced. Thanks to CCD, those dreams have come true.

Suzana came to the U.S. as a refugee in 2016 and was placed in our International Foster Care program. She was frightened when she first arrived; Suzana did not know any English and was shocked by the changes she experienced. Despite those challenges, Suzana said CCD supported her right away.

Her case managers helped her navigate the often-challenging experience of meeting new people and provided tutors to help her learn English. Since then, Suzana has thrived! She graduated from high school with a passion for education and learning. With support from her foster parents and case managers, Suzana continued her schooling and earned her associate degree from Tarrant County College. This fall, Suzana is attending classes at Texas Women's University, where she plans to major in education and become an elementary school teacher.

When Suzana reflects on her journey, she is struck by the compassion CCD has shown her. She is grateful to have a family who makes her smile daily. The love of a family is something Suzana never imagined she would have, and she is thankful to Catholic Charities Dallas for bringing them together.

Our **Children's Services** team provides daily care, supervision, and case management services to eligible unaccompanied immigrant and refugee youth.

Our top priority is reunifying children with their families as quickly and safely as possible. When this is not an option, we seek permanent and supportive relationships for our youth and equip them with the skills needed for successful lives in adulthood. Our team is able to provide this support thanks to a wide range of community members including foster parents, mentors, tutors, and host homes.

Our team offers holistic services including intensive case management, foster home development and support, indirect financial support for housing, food, clothing, and other necessities, educational support including tutoring and ESL, job skills and independent life skills training, mental health services, ongoing family tracing, cultural activities, and recreational activities.

Donna struggled to manage her severe diabetes for two decades. After recovering from a serious case of COVID that left her hospitalized for weeks and caused complications with her diabetes, Donna knew she needed to find a doctor. However, she was uninsured and had limited options, that is, until she found the Community Health Clinic.

When Donna saw her doctor at CHC for the first time, she knew it was different. Donna shared that her doctor took the time to get to know her and learn about her health concerns. She truly felt heard.

Together, they have worked to get the resources Donna needs to improve her health. Donna has significantly lowered her blood sugar, and for the first time in years, she is managing her diabetes. Donna’s doctor helped her find medicine combinations that work best for her, and she can get her medication for free, including her insulin, thanks to CHC. No matter what she needs, whether it is more medical supplies, help with paperwork, or someone to answer her questions, Donna said CHC is there to help.

Donna shared she has benefited from so many services at CHC, but her biggest blessing is knowing she has a doctor who will listen to her and her needs, and that gives her peace of mind.

The **Community Health Clinic** provides compassionate and quality healthcare to underserved and uninsured families in Collin County. By providing health security, CHC enables people to focus on what truly matters and realize their highest potential in work, life, and community.

CHC staff and volunteers provide primary care, chronic disease management services (including cardiovascular disease, diabetes, high blood pressure, allergies and asthma, and thyroid disease), women’s wellness services, pediatric care, counseling, and prescription assistance.

CHC has been serving uninsured individuals and families in Collin County since 2004. In March 2023, CHC entered into a strategic alliance with CCD to increase the clinic’s reach and impact throughout Collin County and beyond.

The long-term vision of the alliance is to expand clinic locations and services within Collin County and beyond, as well as offer CHC patients additional support through CCD programs, including basic needs assistance, educational programs, and legal aid.

## “I CANNOT TELL YOU HOW GREAT CCD WAS. I DID NOT THINK PEOPLE LIKE THIS EXISTED ANYMORE.”

Joseph was one of hundreds of people stranded in their homes and vehicles after widespread flooding in Dallas last August. At the time, he was living in his motorhome in south Dallas. As the rain poured down, the stormwaters surged, leaving Joseph trapped. After being evacuated by the police, Joseph and his pets were safe, but he was unsure to whom he should turn for help. Various organizations offered to assist him, yet none could accommodate his unique circumstances – the need to keep his beloved dog and bird close.

During his search for shelter, Joseph's luck changed when he connected with CCD's Disaster Preparedness & Relief Services team. Understanding the depth of Joseph's bond with his animals, CCD embarked on a mission to secure a haven for Joseph and his cherished companions. Within hours, CCD secured a hotel room and transported Joseph and his pets to their temporary home.

Eventually, Joseph returned home and settled back into his daily routine. Shortly after, Joseph realized his generator was not working, so he contacted us for guidance. CCD was able to provide Joseph with a new generator, complete with a three-year warranty. CCD also helped him replace a tire and repair the transmission on his motorhome. This allowed Joseph to stay in his home and alleviated some of the stress that came with restoring it. CCD's dedication and unwavering support helped Joseph weather the storm and empowered him to emerge from the ordeal stronger and more resilient than ever before.

**Disaster Preparedness & Relief Services** addresses the needs of victims of natural and personal disasters, including the COVID-19 pandemic. This service is one of the only programs in the DFW area that offers long-term case management in addition to short-term assistance.

Trained case managers provide relief through financial and material aid, employment assistance, long-term recovery plan development, and help with providing temporary and permanent housing. Additionally, our team empowers communities to be ready for disasters through outreach and education efforts, including establishing disaster respite sites.

## “OUR ENTIRE FAMILY IS GRATEFUL FOR THE TOGETHER WE’RE BETTER PROGRAM.”

Diana, a mother of two, worried about the development of her young daughters. Her three-year-old struggled to socialize with others and could not control her emotions. Her infant daughter was also behind in her physical growth. Diana was unsure about what to do and was looking for a place where her children could learn and thrive.

When she heard about the Together We’re Better (TWB) program through her parish, Diana knew it was the perfect solution. She attended weekly classes at one of our 12 TWB sites across four counties. Through this parenting and early literacy program, each daughter received enough children’s books to build their first library. The girls also worked on weekly literacy packets to bring each of their books to life with hands-on, engaging activities. Diana loved participating in the parenting classes, which helped provide her with the necessary knowledge and confidence to be the first teacher for her daughters.

Most of the information gained through the parenting and early childhood classes, especially the importance of daily reading, was new. Diana and her husband had no memories of playing or reading with their parents. Thanks to CCD, Diana can now support her daughters’ physical and emotional learning. More importantly, Diana can help her daughters build the early literacy foundation needed for later academic success.

**Educational Services** is committed to providing high-quality, dual generational literacy programs. It is our mission to partner with parents to build a strong foundation to help lead both generations toward a promising future.

We understand how crucial of a role parents play in their children’s education. Our programs support parents as they improve their English language and literacy skills. We also equip parents to be effective reading coaches for their children.

## “ST. JUDE WAS MY PATRON SAINT WHEN I MADE MY CONFIRMATION... I BELIEVE IN DESTINY.”

Sam’s life took an unexpected turn after the end of a relationship. Struggling to make ends meet, he found himself unable to afford housing on his own and ended up homeless. He spent four months living at The Bridge Homeless Recovery Center before his case manager introduced him to CCD and St. Jude Forest Lane.

When Sam moved into St. Jude, the case managers took the time to understand him in ways he had never experienced. They encouraged his involvement in activities and made his birthday a cherished celebration. When Sam’s doctor approved a therapy dog, a case manager helped him to choose a dog to adopt. As the years went by, Sam started envisioning more. He dreamed of getting a job and saving money for a car. His case managers were ready to support him. With their help, Sam applied for jobs online and got his driver’s license. Before long, Sam found part-time work and saved enough money to purchase a car.

His dreams did not stop there. Earlier this year, Sam put aside enough money to move into his own apartment. As excited as he was to have accomplished this, Sam was sad to leave CCD and the people who made his dreams possible. However, he believed it was time for CCD to offer his spot to another person in need. In some ways, Sam felt it was destiny to live at St. Jude. He grew up Catholic and chose St. Jude as his confirmation patron saint. He believes it is thanks to St. Jude and CCD that he has accomplished his goals, and he is grateful to them every day.

**Homelessness & Housing Services** works with Catholic Housing Initiative, Housing Forward, and other community partners to provide permanent, supportive housing for formerly homeless individuals at St. Jude Forest Lane and St. Jude Park Central.

We provide comprehensive case management for St. Jude residents, including counseling, referrals for medical and mental health services, and securing more independent living. Residents also have access to food, clothing, medical care, and public benefits as needed.

In addition to our St. Jude Centers, our team works to manage clients in Rapid Rehousing and Emergency Housing Voucher programs. We provide medium and long-term assistance and support services to help individuals work toward housing security.

Case management services include referrals to resources in the area, assistance in obtaining needed documentation, and assistance in applying for public benefits.

## “BECAUSE OF CCD, I HAVE FOOD THAT IS HEALTHY AND GOOD FOR ME.”

After retiring, Alain moved to Texas to be closer to her grandchildren. She lived on a fixed income and struggled to pay rent and other bills. Even though she received food stamps, Alain could not afford quality groceries like fresh meat and produce. She was stuck eating toast or cereal for dinner until she found CCD and the Ennis Container Pantry. After driving past the pantry several times, Alain finally stopped to see if they could provide relief.

CCD staff quickly assisted her, and she left the Ennis Container Pantry that day with food and an appointment to return twice a month. Alain was thrilled to find out that she could choose what she needed from the selection of fresh vegetables, meat, eggs, and pantry staples. Thanks to CCD's pantry, Alain has enriched her life and diet. She is now eating balanced meals, losing weight, and has more energy. However, Alain said the help from the pantry did not end there. It has also provided her with a community of people who care for her.

Alain shared that moving to Texas was difficult since she left her circle of friends and other family behind. She often felt alone here, but she connected immediately with the staff at the food pantry. Alain said their kindness and conversation helped her feel less isolated. She never thought she would need to turn to a food pantry for help, but Alain said it means the world to know that CCD is there.

Our **Hunger Services** team strives to alleviate food insecurity within our community every day. We know how important access to fresh food is, so our team works in multiple ways to support our clients.

We offer two “client-choice” pantry locations, which allow individuals and families to choose the food they need in a convenient, safe, and clean environment. Our five mobile community pantries take that assistance further afield. Each month, the mobile community pantries travel to more than 90 sites through the nine counties of the Diocese of Dallas to bring fresh food to those in need.

Javier and his wife, Nancy, never intended to leave their home in El Salvador. However, in 2018, their lives took an unexpected turn when they were forced to flee the country with their four children due to religious persecution. Their harrowing journey to the U.S. took two years. During that time, they were often followed by the people who threatened them in El Salvador. As a result, Javier felt fearful and uncertain about the future.

In late 2020, Javier and his family finally reached the U.S. border and applied for asylum. They were able to live with a friend in Texas who introduced them to CCD. Despite their fears of the asylum process, Javier and Nancy believed in the power of faith and God. Throughout their journey to the U.S., churches provided unconditional support. Nancy and Javier were confident CCD would do the same.

CCD offered pro bono legal aid in connection with the asylum process. A team of lawyers guided Javier through the intricacies of his asylum hearing, and they ensured he was prepared. Earlier this year, Javier received life-changing news - they were granted asylum! For Javier, this brought immense relief. Now, he envisions a bright future for his children who are inspired to become lawyers thanks to the dedication of CCD's legal team. Javier is incredibly grateful to CCD for providing unwavering support throughout the asylum process and for acting as a beacon of hope during a challenging journey.

Our **Immigration Legal Services** caseworkers are committed to helping individuals understand immigration laws and their rights.

We provide low-cost and pro-bono legal services, including family visa petitions, adjustment of status applications, consular visa processing, naturalization applications, permanent resident applications for refugees and asylees, applications for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, and document renewals and replacements.

Immigration Legal Services offers other assistance, including weekly workshops, to help clients complete the naturalization application.

Elena dreamed of a better life for her family and herself. She longed to be a homeowner and wanted to save money for her daughter’s education. However, Elena was a single mother and faced challenges managing her finances. When Elena discovered that CCD offered financial coaching, she signed up immediately. Several years earlier, CCD helped Elena obtain her work permit, and she knew we would help her reach her goals again.

From the beginning, Elena’s financial coach took the time to get to know her and her needs. CCD staff helped Elena acquire her credit score, identify her debt, and learn how much she needed to save to purchase a home. Together, they created a plan for Elena to achieve her dreams.

Elena took advantage of all the educational opportunities CCD and our partners offered. She participated in homebuyer education classes and opened a savings account, which CCD was able to match. Elena shared that it is hard to overestimate the impact of CCD on her life. Before starting the program, she knew nothing about credit scores, budgeting, opening a business checking account, or the importance of good credit. Now, she has accomplished all those things and more. Elena increased her credit score by over 50 points, cut her debt in half, and saved enough to purchase a home. She’s on her way to building a savings account for her daughter’s education and is incredibly grateful. Elena feels fully supported by CCD and recognizes it as the driving force behind her success.

**Next Gen Wealth Academy** helps individuals and families thrive by creating a positive relationship with money through coaching, education, and personal development. We offer personalized financial coaching to help clients learn about credit, savings, debt, and managing expenses.

Our case managers also provide job market counseling to help unemployed or underemployed individuals access support services including job placement, resume assistance, training programs, and more.

Formerly known as Financial Stability & Career Services, we changed the mission name this year to better represent our goal of helping families reach their financial goals and prepare for future success.

Daniel and Jamille dreamed of starting a family. After realizing they could not have children, they decided adoption was the way to achieve their dream.

As a Catholic, Daniel was eager to work with CCD. He and his wife adopted through the Finally Home Program, which connects children in state foster care with permanent, adoptive families. Daniel and Jamille felt CCD supported them well throughout the adoption process.

CCD introduced the couple to multiple children, but Gabriel and Cheree stood out to them due to an unexpected link to the family. Gabriel's middle name was Jamille, which made the couple feel even more connected to him and his sister. They believed it was fate for them to become a family.

Daniel and Jamille said Gabriel and Cheree have completed their family. For Daniel, nothing compares to hearing his children call him “Dad.” The adoption has had a profound impact on Cheree and Gabriel. Gabriel has expressed that he had never experienced such kindness from people before he met his parents. The couple cherishes the journey that led them to their children, Gabriel and Cheree. They are grateful to Catholic Charities Dallas for making their dreams of parenthood a beautiful reality.

**Pregnancy, Parenting, & Adoption** works to promote, protect, and connect loving families for children, through two adoption programs - our Infant Adoption Program and our Finally Home Program.

The Infant Adoption Program provides a safe haven and choice to birth parents and prospective adoptive parents. Through intensive vetting and background screening, we match babies and families to thrive in loving environments. Finally Home works with the Department of Family and Protective Services to place children who are in state custody into permanent adoptive homes that are approved and supervised by our program directors and staff.

Our experienced Pregnancy Program team helps mothers facing an unplanned pregnancy as they explore their options. Our hope is to enable women to make the healthiest and most informed decisions, even in difficult situations. We offer compassionate support, guidance, and resources to help mothers navigate their journey with confidence.

We are here to assist families in Dallas and the surrounding areas who are pregnant and/or have a child between 0-36 months. Our weekly classes support efforts in parenting children, while also offering material assistance, such as diapers and clothes.







We welcome our refugee brothers and sisters with compassion and help them find security in their new home.

## “I HAVE A CAR, I’M WORKING, AND THE MOST IMPORTANT THING, I CAN SUPPORT MY FAMILY.”

Shiwa was forced to flee her home in Afghanistan in 2021 because of her work with the United States military. After a year living in a refugee camp in Abu Dhabi, Shiwa arrived in Dallas in August 2022. Upon her arrival, she was immediately helped by our Refugee Services program. Shiwa was alone for the first time in her life, in a new country, facing new experiences. She said she was able to work through those changes thanks to her case managers from CCD.

Shiwa took advantage of all the support her case managers offered. She enrolled in the Match Grant Program and cultural orientation, and she started looking for a job immediately. When she was worried about finding a job to support herself and her family back in Afghanistan, her case managers gave her the confidence to keep applying. They helped her get a computer to create a resume, taught her about job sites, and connected her with a job counselor.

Shiwa said her case managers treated her like she was a family member, which gave her the strength and courage she needed to learn how to navigate a new country. Six months after her arrival in the U.S., Shiwa found a full-time job working as a case manager for the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants. Shiwa is now independent and able to support her family back in Afghanistan.

**Refugee Services** has a long history of welcoming the stranger. Refugees are men, women, and children fleeing war, conflict, and persecution to seek safety in another country. CCD works alongside and supports clients throughout their journey as they rebuild their lives and become self-sufficient in their new community.

Our team helps place refugees and newly-arrived asylees in new homes and full-time jobs with benefits, where they can begin to assimilate into their new homeland. We also support refugees through English language and civics classes, provide material help, and help them secure legal documents, health insurance, and more.

Baltazar’s journey with CCD began when a neighbor suggested he attend one of the many programs at the Marillac Center. At the time, Baltazar was struggling with feelings of depression. Despite going to therapy for over a year, he could not walk without assistance and suffered from vision loss.

From the beginning, our team dedicated themselves to empowering Baltazar to improve his health and maintain his independence. The staff took the time to get to know him and his needs. Baltazar shared that they encouraged him to attend meals, participate in the weekly fitness classes, and join the social-emotional activities offered at the Marillac Center.

Baltazar’s progress was quickly noticeable. He was thrilled to have clearer vision after the staff provided reading glasses. He regained his muscle control and confidence after participating in the weekly physical fitness activities and can now walk without a cane. He has even accessed medical treatments thanks to the on-site Parkland Clinic. In addition to his physical improvements, Baltazar received food and other necessities from the Marillac Center. With less stress and more time to devote to his well-being, Baltazar began to feel his mental cloud lift away.

Baltazar’s time at the Marillac Center was transformative in many ways. Not only did he experience significant improvements in his physical abilities, but he also found a compassionate and understanding community. His outlook shifted from a place of hardship to the excitement of a second chance, thanks to the warmth, care, and sense of belonging he found with CCD and the Marillac Center.

**Senior Services** empowers adults 60 years and older to maintain their independence by providing services focused on maintaining health and wellness. The Marillac Center is at the heart of our service to seniors, and offers a safe and loving community for seniors during the week.

Our Senior Services team works hard to prevent isolation among seniors and provide a space where they can come together for fellowship, food, and more. Clients are able to access a variety of resources at the Marillac Center, including a free, home-cooked, dietitian-approved lunch every week day.

The Marillac Center offers a variety of day-to-day activities such as arts and crafts, Zumba classes, nutrition education, access to the Parkland Community Clinic, and transportation assistance. Our team is also committed to connecting seniors to community resources including SNAP benefits, Medicare/Medicaid education and registration, medical and mental health referrals, and housing assistance.

To ensure your gift is appropriately designated, we ask that you indicate which program, mission, or project you wish to fund with your donation. Please mark all unrestricted gifts as All Missions Support.

### Corporate Giving

For many companies, giving to Catholic Charities Dallas is a compelling way to support the communities where they do business and where their employees and customers live. Create a program grant, sponsor a special event, host a food or clothing drive, or volunteer with us.

### Stocks & Securities

Donations of stocks, bonds, and appreciated securities or mutual funds are a way to make a significant contribution at a reduced cost. Federal tax laws allow a charitable deduction for the full market value of securities on the date of your gift. Electronic delivery of securities is available. Contact the development team directly for transfer instructions.

### IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution Rollover

Giving CCD part of your retirement assets, such as your IRA, 401(k), or 403(b) is a convenient and smart way to make a gift. This is especially true for those 70.5 years or older who can make a qualified charitable distrubtion from their IRA. This QCD is excluded from your gross income and counted towards your required minimum distribution.

### Matching Gifts

Ask your employer if a matching gift program is offered. You may be able to double or triple your generosity!

### Planned Gifts

These gifts benefit CCD in the future, and in many cases, allow donors to make larger contributions. Planned gifts may be outright, in trust, by will, or in some combination. Become a member of our Guardian Angel Society when you include us in your estate plans.

### Tribute Gifts

You can make a donation in memory of a loved one or to celebrate a special occasion.

### Real Estate & Land

A gift of real estate, such as a personal residence, vacation property, commercial property, or undeveloped land, could be your most impactful donation. If you’ve owned your property for longer than a year and that property has appreciated, giving it to CCD can provide a tax deduction and help avoid capital gains taxes, as well as the burden of maintaining or selling the property.
