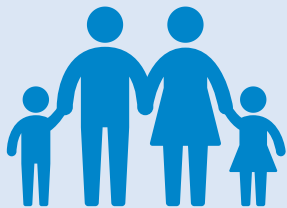

THE COLEMANS

For nearly a decade, the Colemans have generously opened their home to foster youth from around the world, giving them safety, stability, and hope for the future. In partnership with CCD's Children's Services program, they have cared for 16 boys from diverse countries, languages, and faiths, each discovering not only shelter but a true sense of family. Known for their unwavering "yes" when a child needs a home, the Colemans are often among the first foster parents called for a placement.

They are currently caring for two 17-year-old boys, Osseynou from Senegal and Mamadou from Guinea. Both made the long journey from Africa through Central America before reaching the U.S.-Mexico border alone at age 15. Without family to reunite with in the U.S., they were placed in CCD's Unaccompanied Refugee Minor program and joined the Coleman household in 2024.

Since then, the boys have thrived. They are excelling academically, learning essential life skills, and building the confidence required for independent living. They also enjoy engaging regularly in activities with the other youth in the Children's Services program. Most importantly, they have found unconditional support in their new home.

For Osseynou and Mamadou, life in the Coleman home has meant a second chance. With the Colemans' care and the support of the Children's Services team, the boys are stepping into adulthood with hope, confidence, and a sense of belonging they will carry for life.

ISRAEL GARCIA

When Israel walked into the Community Health Clinic in February 2025, he knew something wasn't right. His body felt off, and unexplained symptoms had begun to interfere with his daily life. Concerned but unsure of the cause, he turned to the clinic for answers. Lab tests revealed an A1C level of 13.8, indicating dangerously uncontrolled diabetes that had gone undiagnosed.

The diagnosis was overwhelming, but Israel did not face it alone. The team at the Community Health Clinic quickly surrounded him with compassionate care, creating a treatment plan that paired free medication with diet and lifestyle changes. With steady encouragement and regular appointments, Israel felt supported every step of the way.

In just four months, his health took a dramatic turn. Follow-up tests revealed his A1C had dropped to 5.5 — a remarkable improvement that reflected not only his own determination, but also the life-changing support he received at the clinic.

Today, Israel is living free of diabetes complications and is filled with gratitude for the unwavering care that guided him through a difficult season. His story is a powerful reminder that with the right support, lasting change is possible, one healthy step at a time.

DWIGHT CAMPBELL

When unexpected hardship struck, Dwight did everything he could to stay afloat. After years of working in HVAC, he was used to relying on overtime pay to make ends meet, but when winter slowed business, his hours were reduced. Then, his car was totaled, forcing him to spend what little money he had on rideshares just to get to work. When his girlfriend was hospitalized soon after, medical bills piled up, and he quickly fell behind on rent payments.

For 13 years, he had been a reliable tenant and a steady presence in his apartment community. But this time, despite his best efforts, he needed help. That's when he turned to Catholic Charities Dallas.

Through CCD's Disaster Preparedness & Relief Services, Dwight received rental assistance and financial coaching that helped him avoid eviction and regain stability. CCD caseworkers worked closely with him, communicating with his landlord, helping him budget, and connecting him with food pantry resources to offset his expenses.

With renewed motivation, Dwight picked up extra hours at work and began saving again. The support he received gave him more than financial relief; it restored his confidence. Today, he continues to use the budgeting strategies he learned through CCD, staying focused on his goals and building a more stable, hopeful future one step at a time.

ISRAEL SANTILLAN

Israel's educational journey has been filled with challenges. Since kindergarten, frequent teacher turnover made it difficult to build consistency in learning. Combined with being on the autism spectrum, these disruptions made school feel overwhelming.

Three years ago, his parents enrolled him in the CCD Educational Services summer camp, which was a turning point for the whole family. The camp offered structure, encouragement, and a welcoming environment where Israel could learn and grow. His teacher created a "cool down" area with sensory tools and taught his classmates to understand and respect differences. Though Israel rarely used the space, knowing it was there gave him the confidence to participate in activities with the rest of the class.

Each summer since, Israel's confidence has blossomed. This year, he greeted teachers with enthusiasm, dove into reading challenges and math activities, and even joined swimming lessons, something he once resisted. To teachers and classmates alike, Israel is simply another joyful child enjoying camp to the fullest.

Israel's parents credit the summer camp with providing a sense of belonging during a time of uncertainty, helping him grow not only academically, but also in his love for learning. "The stability, encouragement, and dedication of the teachers each summer have made a tremendous difference in his education, confidence, and faith journey," they shared.

Today, Israel dreams of becoming a priest and hopes to keep growing in faith and academics.

JOSEPH KIRBY

After years of living in an apartment through a shelter program, Joseph began to feel unsafe. The complex had changed. Crime had increased, and his neighbors had become verbally abusive and intrusive. Living with a disability, Joseph was vulnerable and often felt targeted. “I didn’t feel safe anymore. I was being taken advantage of, and I knew I needed a change,” he shared.

In 2019, Joseph was introduced to CCD and the St. Jude Center–Forest Lane. From the moment he visited, he knew it was meant to be his new home. He moved in just before the pandemic began in 2020. At last, he had his own space in a safe and supportive community where he could begin to rebuild his life.

With help from CCD staff at the St. Jude Center, Joseph found access to free, nutritious food, personalized case management, internet, and reliable transportation; resources that had not been available in his previous apartment.

Working closely with his CCD case managers, Joseph achieved goals he once thought impossible: saving money, getting his driver’s license, buying a car, and securing auto insurance. Now, he’s setting his sights even higher by pursuing part-time work, growing his savings, improving his health, and continuing to build his independence.

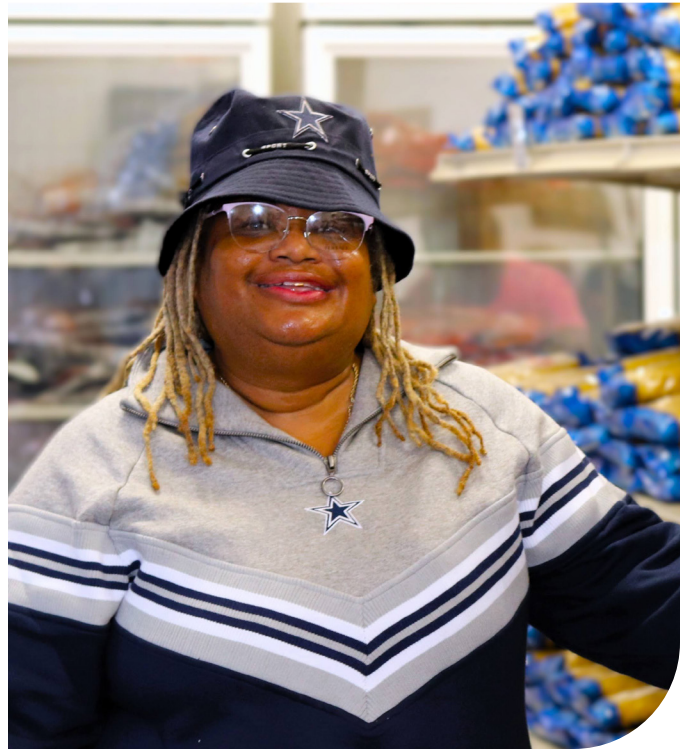
CYNTHIA ROSS

Cynthia sought help while unemployed and caring for seven children, five of whom were foster children. Her generous heart led her to open her home to those in need, but when she could no longer make ends meet, she reached out for help.

Cynthia began visiting the Jan Pruitt Community Pantry, which quickly became the reliable source of nutritious groceries her family needed. The pantry allowed her to shop for her family and choose the foods that would best nourish her children without the added financial burden.

For Cynthia, the support from CCD's Hunger Services program meant stability during uncertain times. She shared that meals are more than just physical nourishment; they are moments that bring her family together. Because the pantry provided her family's groceries, Cynthia could use her limited income for other needs, keeping bills paid on time and sometimes treating her children to something special. Not having to worry about their next meal, she said, was truly a gift.

What might seem like just a bag of groceries to some, Cynthia sees as something far greater: stability, dignity, and the comfort of knowing she is not alone.

“M”

When M first came to Catholic Charities Dallas in January 2015, she was searching for safety and hope after a devastating trauma. Having lived in the U.S. since the age of 13, she faced unimaginable challenges, not only as a survivor of aggravated sexual assault by her biological father, but also as a young woman living with an intellectual disability. Although her abuser was arrested and deported, M was left to navigate the painful aftermath, carrying both emotional scars and overwhelming legal uncertainty.

CCD stepped in to walk with her through every step of her journey. In 2015, the Immigration Legal Services team helped M apply for a U Visa, which provides immigration relief to survivors of serious crimes who cooperate with law enforcement. With patience and resilience, she endured years of waiting. In 2019, she received the life-changing news that her U Visa had been approved, a critical step toward stability and healing.

But her journey didn't stop there. CCD continued to stand beside her, filing for her lawful permanent residency in 2023. On August 21, 2025, ten years after first seeking help, M's green card was approved. This milestone brought her not only legal security but also peace of mind and the freedom to envision a brighter future.

Today, M lives with renewed confidence, knowing she is supported by a caring community that believes in her worth. Her story is a shining example of the transformative impact of compassion in action.

Today, she is building a brighter future for her business, her family, and herself.

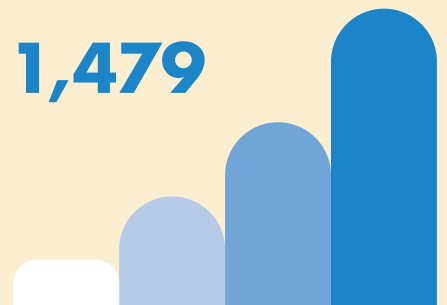

Jennifer and Daniel's journey shows the life-changing impact of CCD's Finally Home program, not only for individual children, but for siblings at risk of being separated in foster care. After years of navigating adoption challenges, the couple expanded their preferences and were introduced to a sibling group of four: Harley (16), Kaley (14), Austin (12), and Haley (11).

At first, the idea of adopting four children at once felt overwhelming. But as Jennifer and Daniel got to know the children, they quickly realized how special this group was. They also realized how important it was to keep them together. Over several visits and virtual meetings, they learned about each child's unique personality and interests. From football and cosmetology to monkeys and unicorns, each child brought something unique; but together, they shared a bond that was unbreakable and worth preserving.

On National Adoption Day, their adoption was finalized. As a sign of commitment to their new beginning, the siblings decided to hyphenate their last names, weaving their new family name into the one they already shared.

Since then, the family's home has been louder, busier, and full of joy. For Jennifer and Daniel, the laughter, chaos, and love are reminders of why they said yes. For the siblings, it's the security of knowing they will grow up together in a family that is theirs forever.

SAIFULLAH KARRIMI

When Saifullah arrived in the United States on January 10, 2025, he carried with him years of sacrifice and resilience. In Afghanistan, he had served alongside U.S. military forces as both a soldier and a translator, risking his life daily to support their mission. But after the government collapse in 2021, he was forced into hiding under threat from the Taliban. For more than three years, Saifullah and his family lived in fear, with no financial stability and no clear future.

When his Special Immigrant Visa was finally approved in late 2024, hope returned. Upon arrival in Dallas, CCD's Refugee Services team welcomed his family of eight, securing housing and helping them settle. CCD supported the family with rent and utilities, enrolled them in the Refugee Cash Assistance program, and helped them access SNAP, Medicaid, TANF, and housing stabilization services. Through the Refugee Health Promotion program, Saifullah learned to navigate the healthcare system, and his wife received Pregnancy Medicaid just in time for the birth of their baby in June 2025.

Within a month of being referred to CCD's Employment Program, Saifullah proudly secured a job at Walmart, regaining financial independence. His children are enrolled in school and are adjusting well to life in Texas. With safety restored and new opportunities ahead, Saifullah dreams of improving his English and building a career in logistics. He is hopeful for the future that lies ahead for his family.

ANDRES RODRIGUEZ

When Andres arrived at the Brady Senior Center in October 2023, he was exhausted from months of uncertainty. A Cuban refugee battling homelessness, he had been rotating between overcrowded shelters and relying on the occasional kindness of friends offering a place to sleep. Finding a safe place to rest was a daily challenge.

During his first case management sessions, Andres shared his urgent need for housing. CCD's Senior Services team worked with him to create a plan, beginning with applications for senior supportive housing. They provided transportation vouchers so he could return to the Brady Center and enrolled him in the congregate meal program, ensuring a hot, nutritious meal each day. As he spent more time at the center, Andres found himself surrounded by a warm, active community. Having found both security and community, he could turn his attention to building the life he envisioned.

In the months that followed, Senior Services staff helped Andres access food pantries, community resources, and a permanent apartment at one of our St. Jude Centers. He smoothly transitioned into his new home and was connected to an on-site case manager for ongoing support. With housing in place, the team helped him renew his work permit, apply for a state ID, and receive SNAP benefits. Today, Andres has a safe home, opportunities for work, access to mental health services, and a community that understands him.

After retiring during the pandemic, Amie Lay knew she wanted to stay active and connected. Her desire to serve seniors was deeply personal, shaped by the time she spent visiting her mother in assisted living. “I always loved talking to the older residents and hearing their stories. After she passed, volunteering at the Brady Senior Center just felt like a natural next step.”

What began with serving meals soon expanded into leading games and crafts twice a month, something Amie never imagined herself doing. “I told them I wasn’t crafty,” she laughs, “but they helped me, and now I love it. I’m always looking for ideas to bring!”

Amie also volunteers weekly at the drive-thru food pantry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, often alongside a close friend. “It’s all about connection,” she says. “Especially after retirement, it’s important to feel part of a community.”

Her generosity extends beyond her time. She donates supplies, prizes for seniors, and also supports Catholic Charities Dallas through financial contributions. “The more I learned about the organization, the more I wanted to give,” she shares.

Whether assembling Christmas gifts for families or receiving handmade tokens of appreciation from seniors, Amie finds joy in the relationships she’s built. “It’s as much for me as it is for them,” she says. “People just want to be seen, cared for, and connected.”

When asked what keeps her coming back, Amie’s answer is simple: “The sense of community. The smiles. The hugs. The appreciation.”

Amie embodies our mission with heart, humility, and hope.

The Archangels Men's Network is a social and service network of men across the Diocese of Dallas, providing opportunities for fellowship, service, and outreach through a variety of initiatives, events, and social activities that strengthen and support the mission of CCD.

As a network of over 400 Catholic men, the Archangels unite through social, service, and philanthropic endeavors within the community. They share their faith, pray and work together, encourage others to join the mission, and support one another along the way.

Each year, the Archangels help provide thousands of meals to families in need by raising funds to support CCD's Hunger Services mission through annual events such as Breakfast with the Bishop and the Archangels Cup golf tournament. They also foster fellowship by hosting Archangel Happy Hours throughout the year and engaging in service projects.

Philanthropic Spotlight

MARY ANN & MAX WERNICK

Mary Ann and Max Wernick's journey with Catholic Charities Dallas began over 40 years ago with the adoption of their daughter, facilitated by Sister Janice at Marywood in Austin. When Sister Janice later moved to Dallas to lead the preschool at the Marillac Center, the Wernicks stayed connected, supporting her work and joining with others to form a support community for adoptive families. That early bond and the evolution of the Marillac Center under Catholic Charities Dallas sparked a lifelong commitment and relationship with CCD.

They truly believe that if you have been blessed, you have the responsibility to give back—and that their call to serve has always been guided by three core priorities: addressing homelessness, alleviating hunger, and supporting education. These priorities aligned seamlessly with Catholic Charities Dallas' missions, making their involvement both an easy and deeply meaningful decision.

Max, drawn to CCD's hunger mission, now serves on the Archangels Board and Development Committee, contributing time, expertise, and leadership to CCD programs like Shared Services, a shared facilities and services network for Catholic schools, including St. Mary of Carmel School where for many years Mary Ann has shared her gardening skills with its students in their Mary Garden. They both have long supported the Angels of Charity's Hope for the Holidays and CCD's Christmas Distribution programs, which now provide holiday gifts to over 600 families in need.

Their impact is also seen at the St. Jude Centers, helping support residents across three centers who were formerly homeless, as well as events like Breakfast with the Bishop and the Annual Golf Tournament where proceeds go to support

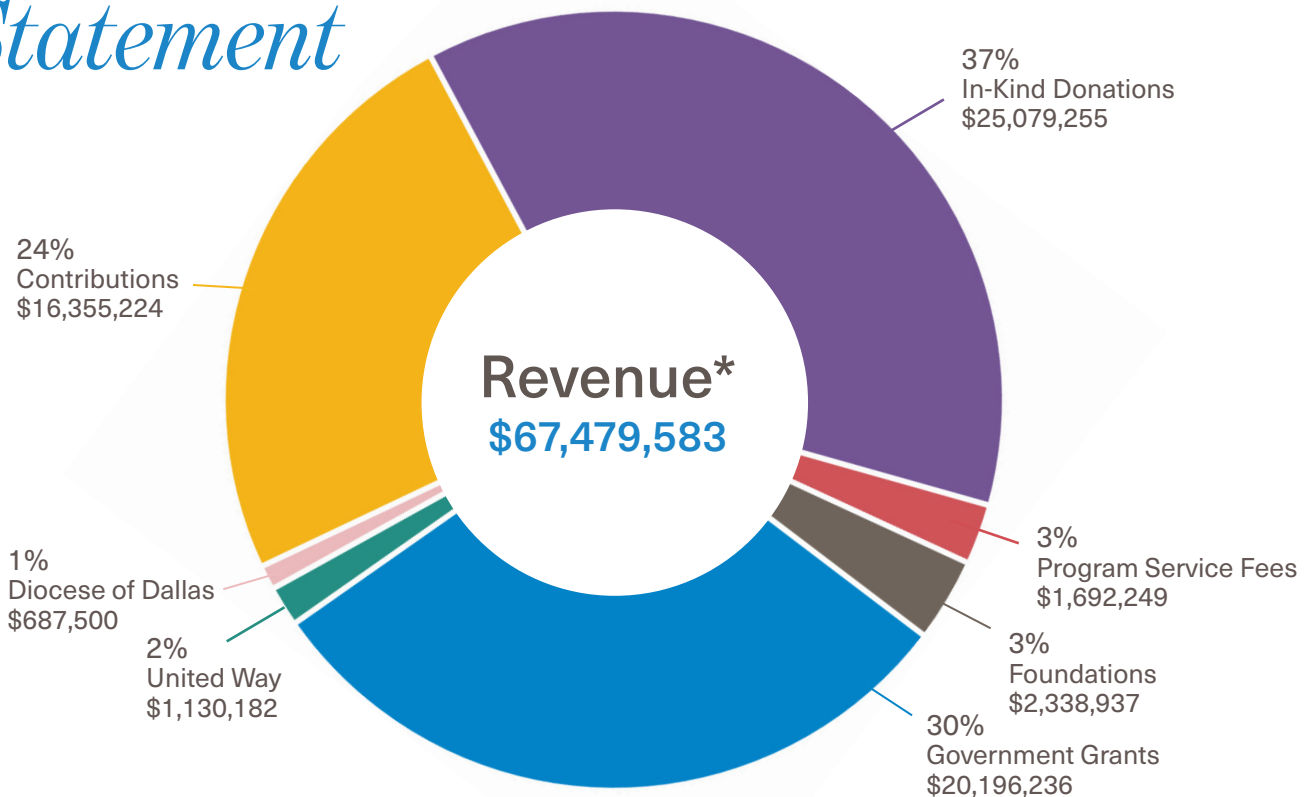

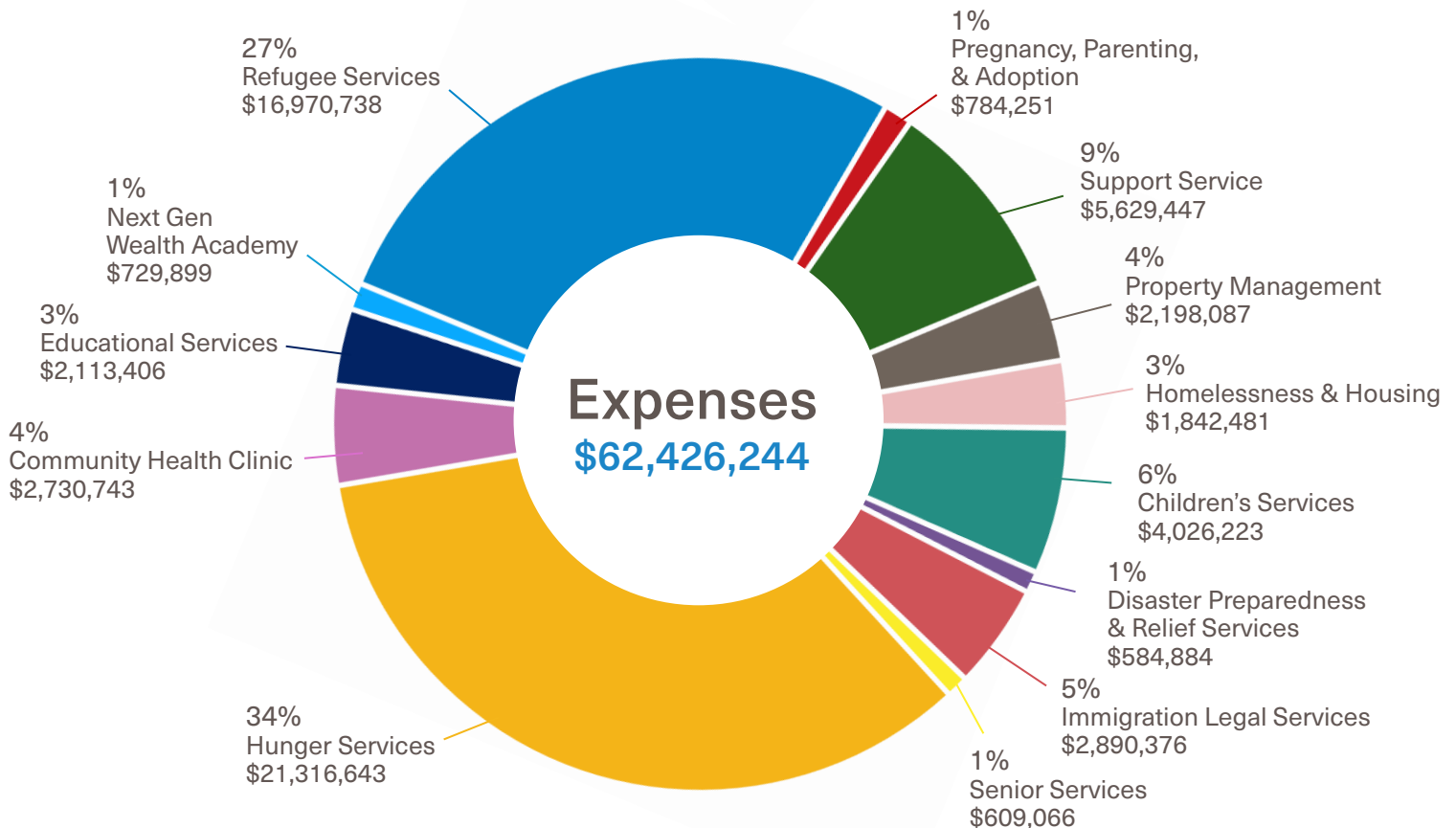

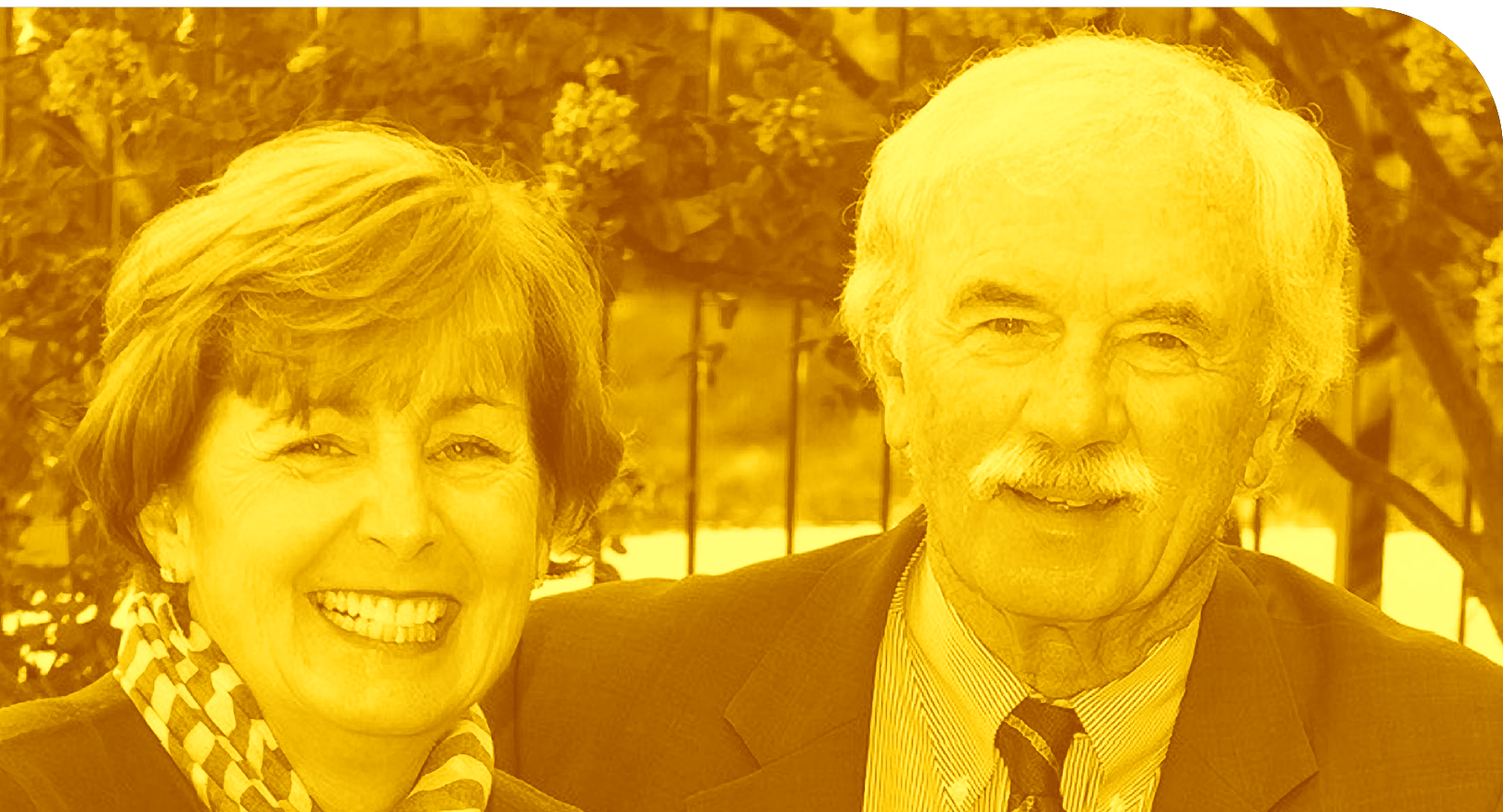
